## **Notes Regarding Grade 10 Course Requests**

- 1. The due date for course request forms and next year's tuition deposits is Wednesday, March 26, 2025.
- To complete the registration for the upcoming academic year, Saskatchewan students must return this form to the general office. A \$1000 tuition deposit must be paid to the College <u>online</u>, by e-transfer to <u>financemanager@luthercollege.edu</u> or in person on March 20 & 21, 2025. Non-Saskatchewan students must return this form to the general office, and the full payment of tuition and dorm fees must be made.
- 3. For answers to academic questions regarding both our regular and International Baccalaureate (IB) programs, students should attend the **information sessions** with the **Academic Vice Principal** scheduled during English classes.
- 4. Mathematics: Grade ten students have three Mathematics options:

□ **Foundations 10** > This is a slower-paced, full-year math program in which students complete both the Workplace & Apprenticeship 10 and Foundations & Pre-Calculus 10 credits.

 $\Box$  Foundations 10 & 20 > This is a regular-paced, full-year math program in which students complete both the Foundations & Pre-Calculus 10 and Foundations 20 credits.

□ **Foundations 10 & 20 – IB Prep** > This is a faster-paced, full-year math program in which students complete Foundations & Pre-Calculus 10 and Foundations 20 credits, with additional enrichments to prepare for IB Math.

To request any of these courses, students need the **signed recommendation** of their current math teacher.

- 5. Choir 10 is a full-year program in which students receive two credits: Choral 10 and Music 10. Students who choose to take Choir 10 for only one semester will not receive any credits; however, students who complete the full-year program will earn two credits.
- 6. **Band** is a regularly scheduled class in the second semester; however, to earn this credit, students will augment this class rehearsal time with musical pit orchestra, individual performance opportunities, and Candlelight orchestra.
- 7. International Baccalaureate (IB): Students interested in a broad, balanced, international curriculum are encouraged to apply in the spring of their Grade 10 year for the IB diploma program (DP), which is a two-year program that begins in the fall of Grade 11. DP students select three Higher Level (HL) subjects and three Standard Level (SL) subjects to study over the two years. At the Higher Level, Luther offers English, History, and Biology; students who score well in these HL classes receive university credits. At the Standard Level, Luther offers Mathematics, Chemistry, Environmental Systems & Society, French, German, Theatre Arts, Film, Music, and Visual Art. Please contact the IB Coordinator or www.ibo.org for further information. Students who request an IB course should not request the corresponding regular class. Students who request the full IB diploma program or individual IB courses will incur additional fees in Grade 11 and 12 (see website for more details).
- 8. All course descriptions can be found on the Luther College High School website under Academics > Curriculum.
- 9. Graduation Requirements: To be eligible for a Luther diploma, students must obtain a minimum of 26 credits, five of which must be earned at the 30-level. Students require a minimum of 10 credits in grade ten, a minimum of 8 credits in grade eleven, and a minimum of 8 credits in grade twelve. The compulsory courses in grade ten are: ELA A10 and ELA B10, History 10, Ethics 10, Math 10, Science 10, Financial Literacy 10, and Wellness 10. The compulsory courses in grade eleven are: ELA 20, English Literature & Composition 20, History 20, Christian Ethics 20, Math 20, and Science 20. The compulsory courses in grade twelve are: ELA A30 and ELA B30, History 30, Christian Ethics 30, Math 30, and Science 30.
