Notes Regarding Grade 11 Course Requests

- 1. The due date for course request forms and next year's tuition deposits is Wednesday, March 26, 2025.
- 2. To complete the registration for the upcoming academic year, Saskatchewan students must return this form to the general office. A \$1000 tuition deposit must be paid to the College online, by e-transfer to financemanager@luthercollege.edu or in person on March 20 & 21, 2025. Non-Saskatchewan students must return this form to the general office, and the full payment of tuition and dorm fees must be made.
- 3. For answers to academic questions regarding both our regular and International Baccalaureate (IB) programs, students should attend the **information sessions** with the **Academic Vice Principal** scheduled during English classes.
- 4. **Mathematics**: Students who took the **slower-pace** math option (Foundations 10) in grade 10 should request at least Foundations 20 for their grade 11 year. Students who took the **regular-pace** math option (Foundations 10 and 20) in grade 10 are recommended to request Pre-Calculus 20 and Foundations 30 for their grade 11 year. This allows students to be able to request Pre-Calculus 30 and Calculus 30 in their grade 12 year without creating any scheduling conflicts. Students who took the **faster-pace** math option (Foundations 10 & 20 IB Prep) should request IB Math 20 SL, which is equivalent to Pre-Calculus 20 and Pre-Calculus 30. In their grade 12 year these students will again request IB Math 30 SL, which is equivalent to Calculus 30.
- 5. Sciences: In selecting their grade 11 science courses, students should consider the pre-requisites for grade 12 science classes and their educational goals at university, college, or other post-secondary programs. During grade 11, students should take the pre-requisite sciences for their grade 12 sciences; otherwise, they may experience scheduling conflicts in their grade 12 year. For example, students planning to study Biology 30 will need to complete Health Science 20 or Environmental Science 20. To view the list of pre-requisite science classes, see the Grade 12 Course Request form which is posted on the school's website under Academics > Curriculum > Courses and Forms. Luther recommends that students take two 20-level sciences.
- 6. **Choir 20** is a full-year program in which students receive **two** credits: Choral 20 and Music 20. Students who choose to take Choir 20 for only one semester will **not** receive any credits; however, students who complete the full-year program will earn **two** credits.
- 7. **Band** is a regularly scheduled class in semester two; however, to earn this credit, students will augment this class rehearsal time with musical pit orchestra, individual performance opportunities, and Candlelight orchestra.
- 8. International Baccalaureate (IB): Students interested in a broad, balanced, international curriculum are encouraged to apply in the spring of their Grade 10 year for the IB diploma program (DP), which is a two-year program that begins in the fall of Grade 11. DP students select three Higher Level (HL) subjects and three Standard Level (SL) subjects to study over the two years. At the Higher Level, Luther offers English, History, and Biology; students who score well in these HL classes receive university credits. At the Standard Level, Luther offers Mathematics, Chemistry, Environmental Systems & Society, French, German, Theatre Arts, Film, Music, and Visual Art. Please contact the IB Coordinator or www.ibo.org for further information. Students who request an IB course should not request the corresponding regular class. Students who request the full IB diploma program or individual IB courses will incur additional fees in Grade 11 and 12 (see website for more details).

- 10. Graduation Requirements: To be eligible for a Luther diploma, students must obtain a minimum of 26 credits, five of which must be earned at the 30-level. Students require a minimum of 10 credits in grade ten, a minimum of 8 credits in grade eleven, and a minimum of 8 credits in grade twelve. The compulsory courses in grade ten are: ELA A10 and ELA B10, History 10, Ethics 10, Math 10, Science 10, Financial Literacy 10, and Wellness 10. The compulsory courses in grade eleven are: ELA 20, English Literature & Composition 20, History 20, Christian Ethics 20, Math 20, and Science 20. The compulsory courses in grade twelve are: ELA A30 and ELA B30, History 30, Christian Ethics 30, Math 30, and Science 30.
