Luther College at the University of Regina is a new recipient of funding in partnership with the Business + Higher Education Roundtable, with support from the Government of Canada.

The funding agreement is in place until Winter, 2025. It will allow the College to provide students with hands-on experience working in the community towards sustainability initiatives.

Luther College is a strong proponent of work-integrated learning as it connects to our values of innovation, creativity, exploration, and critical thinking. Work integrated learning enriches curriculum, provides students with internship opportunities, guidance from industry experts, and encourages students to engage as active citizens.
